ACTIVITIES Elephant riding, rafting, canoeing, jungle walking, visits to sandy beaches and secluded bays.

Basecamp Masai Mara, Kenya.

WHY This community of luxury huts uses solar electricity, solar-heated water and rainwater shared with local families. The group supports local Masai arts, wildlife and reforestation projects.

ACTIVITIES Walks with Masai guides. Watch herds of wildebeest and elephant, as well as lions, leopards and hyena.
